a nurse at the Charleston University Hospital. He took us to so many places, it is


so beautiful in Charleston. Here we are at the Pineapple Fountain at Waterfront Park.

### Peacebox Notes—Celeste Falvo



I have been re-reading Bruce Wilkinson's book, "The Prayer of Jabez." This tiny book packs a punch!

We read in 1 Chronicles 4:9-10 that Jabez was more honorable than his brothers. His mother had named him Jabez, saying, "I gave birth to him in pain." Jabez cried out to the God of Israel, "Oh, that you would bless me and enlarge my territory! Let your hand be with me and keep me from harm so that I will be free from pain." And God granted his request.

As you are reading this section of scripture, there's a genealogy that is full of hard names to pronounce, when the writer suddenly stops listing names and BOOM there is this prayer! Why did he do that? Was he just tired and his mind began to wander? Or did God just remind him, "Don't forget Jabez." We may never know, but it's there for a reason!

What can we learn from this prayer? I think something very simple, PRAY believing God is going to answer. It's a cry for God to bless and use him. And God does! Jabez is only mentioned here in the Bible, I don't think you see him anywhere else in history. Then we're back to the genealogy just as abruptly. What? Wait, I want to hear more! Silence. But it has made an impact on many, including me.

My family jokingly reminds me that I am now officially OLD! But God is reminding me that he is not done using me and my generation! So many older saints of the church are stepping up and out. Sometimes leading the way in ministry. Sometimes we can feel like we have done our tour of duty, but God seems to be raising us up to get involved. Calling us to do things we may not have done even when we were in full-time ministry!

I was asked the guestion, "Why us?" Why not? I don't fully know. I don't understand. But I feel God has called me to fly across the ocean on a missions trip for the first time in my life! I've heard other older saints are traveling to minister in other countries, starting groups in their churches, making a difference in ways they may not have thought they would be doing at this time in their lives! God is 'enlarging our territories."

#### WHY?

The answer I received is very shocking. It was explained to me that it is mostly because the older generation is so highly respected in other countries that they will listen to what we have to say. They want to learn from our generation and glean from our wisdom, so they listen! People are not quite that reverent in the United States but that should not stop us! As Jabez cried out, "ENLARGE MY TERRITORY!" God placed a call on our lives to serve Him and win souls for the Kingdom, not just when we are "young" but until we take our last breath. I want God to bless me, expand me, have HIS hand upon me, and protect me! Use me until I pass into Eternal Glory with Him! Even when I was housebound for while, I learned that a simple phone call could change everything for someone. A card sent, a text written, however God leads you! God's call on your life is not complete until you hear "Well done!"


